

Anti-Saloon League	one of the major organizations advocating for Prohibition and the most powerful lobby in Washington in the years leading up to Prohibition
blind pig	a drinking establishment similar to a speakeasy with a deceptive or blank facade. Blind pigs were located in basements, behind peepholed doors, or at the back of legitimate stores.
bootlegger	one who manufactures and sells alcohol illegally; a booze smuggler
coffin varnish	homemade alcohol
drunkenness, terms for	lit, oiled, owled, jingled, woozy, fried, boiled, bleary-eyed, under the table, stewed, high, wall-eyed, embalmed, lit up like a store window
dry	as a noun, a person who is against drinking alcohol and is for Prohibition
one-way ride	gangster term for being picked up, driven to a remote locale, and murdered
protection money	fees paid by bootleggers and owners of speakeasies to the local police to avoid arrest, a common practice during Prohibition
raids	a raid by the police or Federal Prohibition agent on a speakeasy or other establishment to make arrests
Real McCoy, the	popular term describing quality liquor
rum runner	liquor smuggler
speakeasy	an Irish word for an undercover bar; a bar or club located in a mansion, penthouse or other private home, behind or in the basement of a legitimate business. New York had an estimated 32,000 speakeasies, all of which sold booze and beer illegally.
tarantula juice	bootleg or homemade liquor
whisper sister	a woman proprietor of a speakeasy
Women's Temperance Union	a major driving force, along with the Anti-Saloon League, in getting Prohibition passed
